We are thankful and trusting that in all of it, God is with us, that He will never leave us nor abandon us. He remains faithful and His love endures forever! One of the things we have enjoyed so much doing together as a family, is riding our bikes in our neighborhood. Thankful that God cares for every detail in our lives. We also celebrated Eliya's 14th birthday and our 15th year anniversary!

ADS Classes:

We have now had 3 classes and a 2-day kick-off retreat since we've been here. One of the things that we all did at the retreat was, everyone shared their testimony. It was amazing to see God's power, healing, and grace in how everyone came to know the Lord. It was a good reminder of how much He loves each and every one of us right where we are...Throughout each week, we are given homework; journaling, reading books from the bible, other books that pertain to our Christian Walk, and/or missions. We have been enjoying it, growing, and connecting with people. We have been so grateful for Antioch Fort Worth Church and their love they have poured out on us since

we've been here.

Homeless ministry:

Proverbs 19:17 "He who has pity on the poor lends to the LORD, and He will pay back what he has given."

Through one of the books we are reading in our ADS class, I was reminded of this verse, and how good it is to show grace, mercy, kindness to those who have nothing. Since being here, we have been asked to be a part of this ministry through the church called, "For the One". A sweet lady at Antioch Fort Worth, the Lord put it on her heart to go after the "one". Every Tuesday and Friday we have about 8 bags full of snacks, drinks, toiletry, hygiene, dog food, a hot meal, and hot coffee. After praying we drive in about a 2 miles radius from the church looking for the 1 in need. We give them the bag of goods and ask if there's anything we can pray for. Since doing this they have built many relationships with those living on the streets. In the last 3 weeks since Sandra and I have been helping, I have been reminding of, 1. The power of prayer, 2. The need for a little love, and 3. We all want to be seen (even those on the street). Even during several of our times of prayer with some, we have seen how Gods love overwhelmed them with His presence as they started to cry. It also convicted me that even in our busyness of life, how often do we ask the Holy Spirit, if someone needs prayer? We are living in a world and time when people are hurting, needing hope, needing Jesus, and just a little prayer. What if we, instead of being rushed to get to our next thing or hurried to avoid someone, we just ask the simple question, "Is there something I can pray for you for?". "For the One" is a ministry that goes in search for the one to show them that they are loved and that they matter. Is a great example of what Jesus did for us. He went in search of us, the one, because He loves us so much and He called us His. He chose us and met us where we were and loved us as we were. Praise Jesus that He came for the sick and made us well!
